Some of the trees that grow there today were planted by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s. Your project is mostly composed of pine, hemlock, and tamarack trees, and will contribute to provide habitat to species that occupy forest instead of open areas like moose, deer, bears, foxes, hares, grouses and many other mammals, birds and insects. It will contribute to the ecosystem resistance and resilience against insects and will also contribute to the capture of carbon through trees thereby fighting climate change.
